CHAPTER 1: INTRODUCTION AND INTERPRETATION

1.1 Introduction

These Bachelor of Laws/Bachelor of Arts (Laws/Arts) Course Regulations apply to all students enrolled in the Laws/Arts Degrees at the University of Notre Dame Australia.

These Regulations should be read in conjunction with the General University Regulations, the School of Law Regulations and the School of Arts and Sciences Regulations.

1.2 Applicability of Honours program to double degree

Honours is available within the following components of the Laws/Arts degree:

- (a) Bachelor of Laws (Honours) / Bachelor of Arts – (Laws(Honours)/Arts)
- (b) Bachelor of Laws/ Bachelor of Arts (Honours) – (Laws/Arts(Honours))
- (c) Bachelor of Laws (Honours) / Bachelor of Arts (Honours) – (Laws(Honours)/Arts(Honours))

1.3 Interpretation

The terms included in these Regulations have the meanings as defined in the University's General Regulations, School of Law Regulations and School of Arts & Sciences Regulations.

1.4 Alterations made to Course Regulations

Unless otherwise specified, when amendments are made to the structure, content or academic requirements of the Laws/Arts degree, the amendments will automatically apply to all students enrolling for the first time in the degree in the year immediately following the adoption of the amendments.

1.5 Applicability to Campuses of the University

The Laws/Arts degree is available on the Fremantle and Sydney Campuses.

CHAPTER 2: ENTRY CRITERIA

- 2.1 The Laws/Arts degrees are open to school leaver and mature age applicants and no percentage quota will be set with regard to the number of each.
- 2.2 The standard entry criteria as detailed in the General Regulations apply to the Laws/Arts degrees.
- 2.3 Entry criteria for the Honours components of the Laws/Arts degrees are detailed in Regulation 3.6 and 3.7 of these Regulations.

CHAPTER 3: DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

3.1 Structure (Appendix A)

- (i) The structure of the Laws/Arts degree is annexed as Appendix A.
- (ii) The structure of the Laws(Honours)/Arts degree is annexed as Appendix B
- (iii) The structure of the Laws/Arts(Honours) degree is annexed as Appendix C
- (iv) The structure of the Laws(Honours)/Arts(Honours) degree is annexed as Appendix D
- (vii) Unless a student receives the prior approval of the Dean (or delegate) to alter the order of study, students are required to enrol in and pass all of the units in each academic year of study as detailed in the course structure before they will be permitted to enrol in units outlined in the subsequent academic year of study.

3.1.1 Compulsory units

- (i) The compulsory units within the law degree are listed in the Course structure at Appendix A.
- (ii) There are no compulsory units in the Arts degree component of the double degree, as the Major chosen by the students will determine the compulsory units. Compulsory units may be selected from an approved list of unit offerings published by the School of Arts & Sciences on an annual basis.

3.1.2 Elective units

- (i) Students enrolled in the Laws/Arts Degrees are required to complete seven law elective units in addition to their compulsory law units. Elective units may be selected from an approved list of unit offerings published by the School of Law on an annual basis.
- (ii) Students enrolled in the Laws(Honours)/Arts degree must choose as two of their seven electives LW441 Advanced Research project, in semesters 1 and 2 of their final full year of academic study.
- (iii) Students enrolled in the Laws/Arts Degrees are required to complete 12 Arts units. Eight of these units must constitute an approved Arts Major with the remaining four units taken as Arts elective units. Elective units (as defined by the General Regulations) may be selected from an approved list of unit offerings published by the School of Arts & Sciences on an annual basis.

3.1.3 Majors/Double Majors

- (i) There are no majors in the law component of the double degree.
- (ii) A student enrolled in the Arts component of the double degree must choose at least one major from the following list. Requirements for each major are as published on the University website:
 - (a) Behavioural Science
 - (b) Communications
 - (c) English Literature
 - (d) Environmental Science
 - (e) Geography
 - (f) History
 - (g) Italian
 - (h) Legal Studies
 - (i) Modern Greek Language
 - (j) Philosophy
 - (k) Politics
 - (l) Social Justice
 - (m) Sociology
 - (n) Theatre Studies
 - (o) Theology

3.1.4 Minors

There are no minors permitted within the Law/Arts double degree.

3.1.5 Specialisations

There are no specialisations permitted within the Law/Arts double degree.

3.2 Practicum or Internship requirements

There are no compulsory Practicum or Internship requirements within the Law/Arts double degree.

3.3 Approved unit substitutions

- (i) The following law unit substitutions may be permitted with the approval of Dean (or delegate):
 - (a) AB100 Aboriginal People may be substituted for LW230 Contemporary Legal Issues
 - (b) BS245 Taxation may be substituted as one law elective;
 - (c) PH316 Legal Reasoning may be substituted as one law elective;
 - (d) PH308 Natural Law may be substituted as one law elective.
- (ii) Unit substitution in the Arts degree is only permitted with the approval of the Dean (or delegate) of the School of Arts & Sciences.

3.4 Course duration

3.4.1 Standard Duration

- (i) The standard duration of the Laws/Arts and Laws (Honours)/Arts Degrees is 5.8 years of full time study.
- (ii) Students are able to enrol in the degree on a part-time basis
- (iii) The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Law/Arts degree is 10 years from the date on which they were first accepted into the course by the University.
- (iv) The standard duration of the Laws/Arts(Honours) and Laws(Honours)/Arts(Honours) Degrees is 7 years of full time study.
- (v) Students are able to enrol in the degree on a part-time basis.
- (vi) The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Law/Arts degree is 10 years from the date on which they were first accepted into the course by the University.

3.4.2 Accelerated Duration

- (i) It is recommended that this course be undertaken in an accelerated mode and students will be advised to do an overload in one or more of the years.
- (ii) The accelerated duration of the Laws/Arts and Laws(Honours)/Arts degree is 5 years of study which will be equivalent to 5.8 years of full time study in standard mode.
- (iii) Students are not able to enrol in the accelerated model degree on a part-time basis
- (iv) The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Laws/Arts and Laws(Honours)/Arts degree in accelerated mode is 10 years from the date on which they were first accepted into the course by the University.
- (v) The accelerated duration of the Laws/Arts(Honours) and Laws/(Honours)/Arts(Honours) degrees is 6 years of study.
- (vi) Students are not able to enrol in the accelerated model degree on a part-time basis
- (vii) The maximum period of time within which a student is permitted to complete the Laws/Arts (Honours) and Laws(Honours)/Arts(Honours) degree in accelerated mode is 10 years from the date on which they were first accepted into the course by the University.

3.5 Graduation

- (i) A minimum of 1250 credit points drawn from the approved course structure is required in order for a student to graduate with the degree Laws/Arts or Law(Honours)/Arts.
- (ii) A minimum of 1500 credit points drawn from the approved course structure is required in order for a student to graduate with the degree Laws/Arts(Honours) or Laws(Honours)/Arts(Honours).

3.6 Honours In The Law Degree

Regulation 3.6 must be read in conjunction with the University *Policy: The Award of a Degree with Honours*.

3.6.1 Admission to an Honours program in Law

- (i) Admission to the Laws/Arts Honours programme is by invitation only (in accordance with School procedures) and is subject to approval by the Dean.
- (ii) A student who is enrolled in the Law degree part time, may enrol in the Honours programme with the Dean's approval.
- (iii) The Honours programme cannot be completed part time.

3.6.2 Selection criteria

- (i) The Honours Coordinator, in consultation with the Dean (or delegate) will make a determination at the end of each academic year as to the eligibility of all penultimate year Laws/Arts Degree students to participate in the Honours program for the following academic year.
- (ii) The academic performance of a student will be the sole basis for determining whether a student is eligible to participate in the Honours program, and that academic performance will be judged according to the Honours Points principles detailed in this regulation.
- (iii) The eligibility of a student for participation in the Honours program will not be considered unless and until they have completed at least 50% of the fulltime load stipulated for the fourth year of the Laws/Arts Degree.
- (iv) To be eligible to participate in the Honours program a student must:
 - (a) have obtained a minimum average grade of midway between a credit and distinction grade over the course of their Laws/Arts Degree as determined using the Honours Points principles detailed in regulation 3.6.3, and
 - (b) using the Honours Points detailed in this regulation, fall within the top 20% of all LLB students (graduate and undergraduate entry) who are due to graduate either at the completion of the next academic year or midway through the following academic year.
- (v) The Dean will invite those students who are eligible to participate in the Honours program to apply to enter the program. No student will be deemed to be enrolled in the Honours program until the Dean (and/or his or her delegate) has formally accepted that student in writing.
- (vi) The Dean's decision on eligibility for entry into the Honours program is final.

3.6.3 Calculation of Academic Performance and Honours Points

- (i) In determining whether a student has achieved a minimum average of midway between a credit and distinction grade over the course of their Laws/Arts degree, a mathematical calculation of the results achieved by the student will be made according to the following scale:
 - (a) a grade of HD in a full year unit is worth 12 Honours Points
 - (b) a grade of D in a full year unit is worth 8 Honours Points
 - (c) a grade of C in a full year unit is worth 4 Honours Points
 - (d) a grade of P in a full year unit is worth 0 Honours Points
 - (e) a grade of F in a full year unit is worth - 4 Honours Points
 - (f) a grade of HD in a one semester unit is worth 6 Honours Points
 - (g) a grade of D in a one semester unit is worth 4 Honours Points
 - (h) a grade of C in a one semester unit is worth 2 Honours Points
 - (i) a grade of P in a one semester unit is worth 0 Honours Points
 - (j) a grade of F in a one semester unit is worth -2 Honours Points
- (ii) For the purposes of these regulations there are no Honours Points attached to the Core Curriculum (LW104, PH100 and TH101) or AB100.

3.6.4 Eligibility for award of Honours Degrees

- (i) If a student is accepted into the Honours program, the student must successfully complete the unit of LW441 Advanced Research Project which is a substitute for and the equivalent of two semester law electives. In completing this unit the student is required to undertake legal research upon a topic approved by the Dean (or delegate) and to present the results of that research in a 12 000-word research paper ("the thesis").
- (ii) A principal supervisor shall be appointed to oversee the research undertaken in fulfilling the requirements of LW441. A co-supervisor may also be appointed.
- (iii) There shall be a minimum of two readers of the thesis, one of whom shall produce a formal examination report to the Dean (or delegate). The other reader will be an assessor of the paper and will confer with the examiner on the production of the final report.

- (iv) Neither the principal supervisor nor any co-supervisor shall be appointed as the examiner.
- (v) The student will be awarded a final grade and mark for their performance in LW441.
- (vi) The LW 441 Advanced Research Project unit attracts double the Honours points allocated to a full year unit as set out in Regulation 3.6.3(i).
- (vii) To be eligible for the award of Honours, a student must have maintained a minimum average of midway between a credit and distinction grade over the final year of their Law/Arts Degree as determined using the Honours Points principles detailed in this regulation.
- (viii) No more than twenty per cent of the graduating class of all LLB students, graduate and undergraduate entry, may be awarded an Honours degree, unless the Dean individually approves the award of an Honours degree to the relevant student or students as constituting a special case.
- (ix) Classes of Honours degree will be determined by the Board of Examiners upon recommendation by the Honours Coordinator. The Honours Coordinator's recommendation will be made after consultation with the Dean (and/or his or her delegate) and will be based on
 - (a) a comparative analysis of the academic performances in the coursework and theses of the students participating in the Honours program, and
 - (b) a consideration of the academic excellence and quality of the students enrolled in the Honours Program against general academic norms and standards.
- (x) If a student who participates in the Honours program fails to maintain their minimum average grade outlined in regulation 3.6.2(iv) and/or does not fall within the top 20% of the graduating class, the student may nonetheless graduate with the Laws/Arts degree provided they have satisfied the academic requirements of the degree.

3.6.5 Examination of Research component

Examination of the Honours research component within the Laws/Arts degree is detailed in the LW441 Advanced Research Project Thesis Marking Guide/Examiners Report, and the *Guideline: Examination of Honours Research Components*.

3.6.6 Awarding Honours

Honours within the Laws/Arts degree is awarded in accordance with the General Regulations (as graded / ungraded pass Honours).

3.7 Honours in the Arts Degree

Regulation 3.7 must be read in conjunction with the University *Policy: The Award of a Degree with Honours*.

3.7.1 Admission to an Honours program

- (a) Admission to the Laws/Arts (Honours) and Laws (Honours)/Arts (Honours) is by invitation only (in accordance with School procedures) and is subject to approval by the Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences.
- (b) Enrolment in the Laws/Arts (Honours) and Laws (Honours)/Arts (Honours) program on a part-time basis is permitted with the Dean's approval.

3.7.2 Selection criteria

The following selection criteria will be used for a student applying for or being invited to enrol in an Honours program:

- (a) To be considered for entry to the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) year, a student must normally achieve an average of 70% or higher in the major within their degree.
- (b) Any student may be admitted to the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) year on the recommendation of the Honours Supervisor and with the Approval of the Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences.
- (c) No student will be accepted into an honours program unless the Dean has determined that the School has the staff expertise and facilities capable of supporting the applicant.

3.7.3 Compulsory Honours coursework units

- (a) One undergraduate unit in each semester of the student's honours year is to be selected in consultation with the supervisor. One 5000 word essay of honours-level quality must be submitted to the honours coordinators during or prior to Week 10 of the semester, based on a theme or topic relevant to the unit. A minimum 85% attendance in class is mandatory. Each essay is worth 20% of the final honours grade (40%).
- (b) The student is to attend a weekly workshop series run over both semesters, and contribute to the discussion of student research progress and problems. Attendance for at least 85% of all workshops is necessary to successfully complete the Honours Program.

3.7.4 Compulsory Research component

Each student is required to:

- (a) Present a seminar paper to the School of Arts and Sciences in Week 6 of the student's first semester, outlining the proposed thesis research including its topic, main questions and objectives, and anticipated outcomes.
- (b) Submit a research proposal and required ethics applications to the School of Arts and Sciences, prepared under the guidance of their supervisor, in Week 8 of the student's first semester of enrolment.
- (c) Present a second seminar paper in Week 6 of the student's last semester, outlining the methods which were applied, the objectives and questions which were addressed and the main findings (or anticipated findings) which were determined in the student's thesis research.
- (d) Submit for examination an honours-level thesis of between 18,000 and 20,000 words in Week 12 of the student's second semester (or part-time equivalent). The thesis is worth 60% of the final honours grade.

3.7.5 Examination of Research component

The research thesis is examined by at least two examiners, one of whom is usually external to the University.

3.7.6 Awarding Honours

- (a) A student must achieve a final mark for that year of at least 60% to be awarded a degree with honours.
- (b) Honours within the Bachelor of Arts (Honours) is awarded as graded Honours in accordance with the General Regulations.
